

#### **District 8 Competition**

## **Medical Assisting Contest**

#### **Purpose:**

To evaluate each contestant's preparation for employment and to recognize outstanding students for excellence and professionalism in the field of medical assisting.

#### **Clothing Requirements:**

Official blue scrubs, white socks or skin-tone seamless hose and health professional's white leather work shoes.

Work shoes must be all-white leather (no canvas), completely enclosed (no open toe or open heel). Athletic style shoes that meet the aforementioned criteria are acceptable.

#### **Eligibility:**

Open to active SkillsUSA members enrolled in programs with medical assisting as the occupational objective.

#### **Equipment and Materials:**

### **Contest Specifications:**

The contest includes an assessment of proficiency of skills in the following areas:

- 1. Complete history and assessment
- 2. Measure and record oral/axillary/aural temperature
- 3. Measure and record pulse
- 4. Measure and record respirations
- 5. Measure and record blood pressure
- 6. Demonstrate emergency measures for choking
- 7. Handwashing

Contestants will be evaluated on neatness, professional appearance and communication skills.

Measures, Records and Reports Client's Blood Pressure			
Procedure:	Yes (+1)	No (0)	Comments:
1. Washes hands before contact with client.			
2. Identifies yourself to client by name and			
address client by name.			
3. Explains procedure.			
4. Provides privacy and make client comfortable			
sitting or lying.			
5. Before using stethoscope, wipes the			
bell/diaphragm and earpieces of stethoscope with			
alcohol.			
6. Client's arm is positioned with palm up and			
upper arm is exposed.			
7. Feels for brachial artery on inner aspect of arm			
at the bend if elbow.			
8. Places blood pressure cuff snugly on client's			
upper arm, with sensor/arrow over brachial			
artery.			
9. Earpieces of stethoscope are in ears and			
bell/diaphragm is over brachial artery site.			
10. Candidate inflates cuff between 160 mm Hg to			
180 mm Hg. If beat heard immediately upon cuff			
deflation, completely deflate cuff. Re-inflate cuff			
to no more than 200 mm Hg.			
11. Deflates cuff slowly and notes the <b>First</b> sound			
(systolic reading) and <b>Last</b> sound (diastolic			
reading). If rounding needed, measurements are			
rounded UP to the nearest 2 mm Hg).			
12. Removes cuff.			
13. Signaling device is within reach.			
14. Before recording, washes hands.			
15. After obtaining reading using BP cuff and			
stethoscope, records both systolic and diastolic			
pressures each within plus or minus 8 mm Hg of			
evaluator's reading.

temperature and remembers reading.			
9. Read the temperature on the display screen.

10. Removes and discards gloves.

13. Documents temperature, date, time and			
method used.

Free Thermometer)

1. Washes hands.			
2. Identifies self by name and identifies resident			
by name.			
3. Explains procedure.			
4. Provides privacy.			
5. Puts on gloves.			
6. Put a disposable sheath over earpiece of the			
thermometer.			
7. Position the resident's head so that the ear is in			
front of you. Straighten the ear canal by pulling			
up and back on the outside edge of the ear. Insert			
the covered probe into the ear canal. Press			
button.			
8. Hold thermometer in place either for one			
second or until thermometer blinks or beeps.			
9. Read temperature. Remember the temperature			
reading.			
10. Dispose of sheath. Return the thermometer to			
storage or to the battery charger if thermometer			
is rechargeable.			
11. Removes and discards gloves.			
12. Washes hands.			
13. Immediately record the temperature, date,			
time and method used.			
14. Places call light within resident's reach.

Emergency Choking Procedures			
Procedure:	Yes (+1)	No (0)	Comments:
1. Ask "Are you choking?"			
2. Give abdominal thrusts (chest thrusts for			
pregnant or obese victims).			
3. Repeat thrusts until effective or victim becomes			
unconscious.			
Adult Foreign-Body Airway Obstruction- Victim			
becomes unconscious			
4. Activate EMS system.			
5. Perform a tongue-jaw lift followed by a finger			
sweep to remove the object.			
6. Open airway and try to ventilate; if still			
obstructed, reposition head and try to ventilate			
again.			
7. Give up to 5 abdominal thrusts.			
8. Repeat steps 5 through 7 until effective.

Perform Correct Hand Washing			
Procedure:	Yes (+1)	No (0)	Comments:
1. Turns on water at sink, keeping clothes dry.			
2. Angles arms down, holding hands lower than			
elbows. Wets hands and wrists thoroughly.			
3. Applies soap to hands.			
4. Lathers all surfaces of hands, wrists, and			
fingers, producing friction for at least 30 seconds.			
5. Cleans nails by rubbing them in palm of other			
hand.			
6. Rinses all surfaces of wrists, hands, and fingers,			
keeping hands lower than the elbows and the			
fingertips down.			
7. Uses clean, dry paper towel to dry all surfaces			
of hands, wrists and fingers. Disposes of towel			
without toughing wastebasket.			
8. Uses clean, dry paper towel to turn off faucet,			
without contaminating hands.			
9. Disposes of used paper towel(s) in wastebasket			
immediately after shutting off faucet.
